Please note: The scriptures marked with an asterisk (*) are those which I will be reading aloud.

I. Chapter One (The situation)

- a. Daniel places events in space and time (*Dan 1:1-2)
 - (1) Event: Siege of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar
 - (2) Time: Third year of reign of Jehoiakim or approx 605 to 606 BC (Final siege and fall of Jerusalem approx. 586 BC)
 - (3) Place: Jerusalem and then Babylon
- b. Why Judah went into captivity 70 years
 - (1) God's command (*Lev 25:1-7,18-23)
 - (2) God's warning (*Jer 25:9-12)
 - (3) Consequence of disobedience (*II Chron 36:17-21; *Jere 1:12; Isa *46:11)
- c. Daniel and three friends given Babylonian names in attempt to assimilate them into the culture (*Dan 1:7)
 - (1) Daniel in Hebrew (God is my Judge) becomes Belteshazzar (favored by Bel)
 - (2) Hananiah in Hebrew (The Lord's beloved) becomes Shadrach (illuminated by Rak)
 - (3) Mishael in Hebrew (Who is as God) becomes Meshack (Belonging to Shak)
 - (4) Azariah (The Lord is my help) becomes Abednego (Servant of Nego)
- d. God gave Daniel and his friends wisdom and understanding (*Dan 1:16)
 - (1) Promise of wisdom to us (*Jas 1:5-8)

II. Chapter Two (Layout of future for Gentile World Powers)

- a. Nebuchadnezzar's Dream and Decree (*Dan 2:1-13)
- b. Daniel's response to the decree (*Dan 2:14-16)
- c. Daniel and his friends pray (*Dan 2:17-18)
 - (1) Prayer of agreement for us (*Mat 18:19-20)
- d. The dream revealed to Daniel (*Dan 2:19)
- e. Daniel praises God (*Dan 2:20-23)
 - (1) It is God who sets up kings and removes them (*Dan 2:21)
 - (2) Praying for those in authority today (*I Tim 2:1-3)
