 - a. Paul understood “Big Picture” (II Cor. 12:2-4; Romans 8:18; *II Cor 4:16-18; Phil 1:21-24; II Cor 11:23-33)
 - b. Jesus understood “Big Picture” (*Hebrews 12:2)

 - a. Written by: The Apostle John (Rev 1:4)
 - b. When: Probably around AD 95 or 96
 - c. Where: the Isle of Patmos (Rev 1:9)
 - d. Under what circumstances: John was exiled “for the word of God, and for the testimony of Jesus Christ.” (Rev 1:9)
 - e. Written to whom: to the seven churches (ie to believers) (Rev 1:4)

- IV. Common Misconceptions
 - a. Because contains apocalyptic literature, very confusing and difficult to understand (I Corinthians 14:33)
 - i. “Apocalupsis” Gk. Meaning to unveil or uncover.
 - b. Is a depressing book of doom and gloom.
 - c. Is all about the tribulation
 1. Helps us to know where we are in time (I Chronicles 12:32)
 - d. Too complicated (Deut 29:29)

- V. Brief description of classic viewpoints on interpreting Revelation
 - a. Preterist View: Sees events in Rev as occurring during first two or three centuries of Church history
 - b. Historicist View: Sees events in Rev. as occurring through church history.
 - c. Idealist View; Sees events as symbolic depiction of good versus evil
 - d. Futurist View: Sees events after third chapter of Rev as yet future (*Isaiah 46:9-10; Amos 3:7)
