## READING

*1 Corinthians 2:1-16*

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written,

“What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,  
 nor the human heart conceived,  
 what God has prepared for those who love him”—

these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

Those who are unspiritual do not receive the gifts of God's Spirit, for they are foolishness to them, and they are unable to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. Those who are spiritual discern all things, and they are themselves subject to no one else's scrutiny.



The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.




Glo - ry be to Thee, O Lord.

#### THE SERMON

*The Rev. Dr. David Barr*

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. ## MUSIC NOTE

The anthem *If ye love me* by Philip Wilby (b. 1949) uses rich and sumptuous melodic lines to create a beautiful dialogue between the choir and the organ accompaniment. There is a sense of assurance as the whole choir sings the melodic line together in unison, evoking a sense of commitment to Jesus' teachings. Lush harmonic language contrasts to the light, beautiful melody sung by the choir in unison. *Lord, I Trust thee* by George F. Handel (1685-1759) is a simple, yet wonderfully delightful anthem for our communion. The text's meaning is strengthened by the choir's dense 4-parts harmony supported by an organ accompaniment that may sound effortless, but that elevates the text with subtle flourishes and ornaments.
