

## READING

*1 Corinthians 1:18-31*

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

“I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,  
and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart.”

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God’s foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God’s weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, “Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.”




The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.



## MUSIC NOTE

Today's offertory anthem, *Jesu, the very thought of thee*, reflects Christ's role as a teacher, as well as his teachings. This beautiful text attributed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux (12th c.) was set by Edward Bairstow (1874-1946). Bairstow uses the English translation instead of the original Latin text, and he creates beautiful musical expression with soaring climactic highs and smaller contemplative moments throughout. Thomas Attwood (1765-1838) was an important figure in early Anglican music before it fully blossomed in the later Romantic period. A student of the famous composer Wolfgang A. Mozart, Attwood held important several positions, including the organist of St. Paul's Cathedral. He was also close to composer Felix Mendelssohn, whose organ concerts staged during visits to England influenced the development of organ and sacred music immensely. Attwood's musical style reflects that of Mozart; elegant, tuneful, and clear to the text. *Teach me, O Lord* uses elegant melodic lines to remind us how we can open our minds to the teachings of Jesus.



The building crew continues to work throughout the day and the voicing crew overnight to prepare for our organ dedication events.
