The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.



Christ will come again.

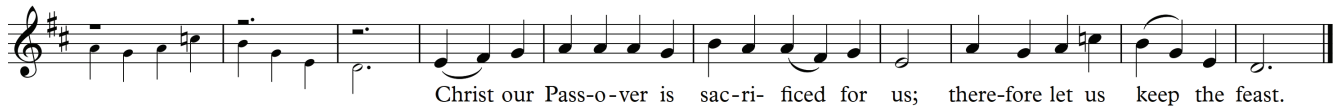

MUSIC NOTE

God so loved the world was written by contemporary British composer Bob Chilcott (b. 1955) and draws its text from today's gospel reading. An active composer and conductor, Chilcott was a part of The King's Singers, whose members previously served as choral scholars at King's College, Cambridge. This Scripture passage is always included in the lectionary each Lenten season, as it is a solemn reminder of love and grace of God. Chilcott sets this text with a sweet, gentle, and soothing melody. When it is repeated, a soloist sings a haunting vocal decoration above the choir. *Psalm 121* from Herbert Howells's (1892-1983) *Requiem* is a musical interpretation of today's psalm. After the opening solo, the choral parts move freely, then explode into strong acclamations for verses 4 and 5, projecting assurance and conviction.
