And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

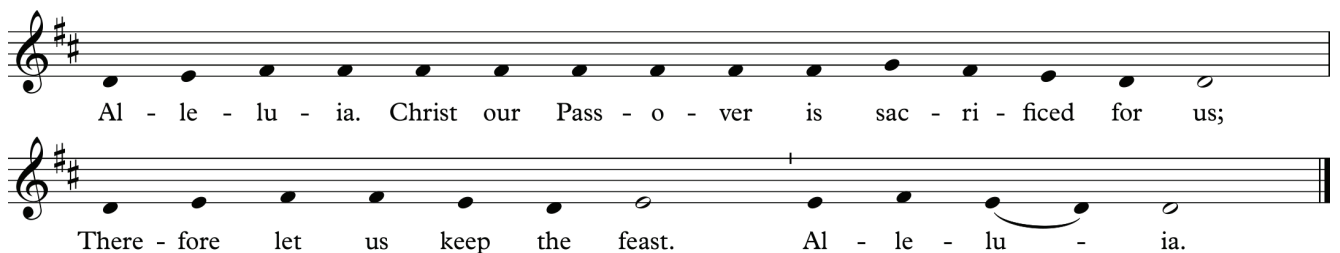

MUSIC NOTE

E'en so, Lord Jesus, quickly come is the most well-known choral anthem by American composer Paul Manz (1919-2009), whose wife paraphrased a passage from Revelation 22 to create the text of the anthem as they were nursing their sick child. It has a fluid melodic lines and sumptuous harmonies that represent a sense of prayerful patience and urgency, yet still joy. This anthem is a great response to our epistle reading reminding us to be alert for the coming of Jesus. *Ave verum corpus* by Edward Elgar (1857-1934) is a beautiful rendition of a centuries-old eucharistic text. One can hear Elgar's signature lyricism throughout with warm harmonies offering an invitation to the Lord's table.

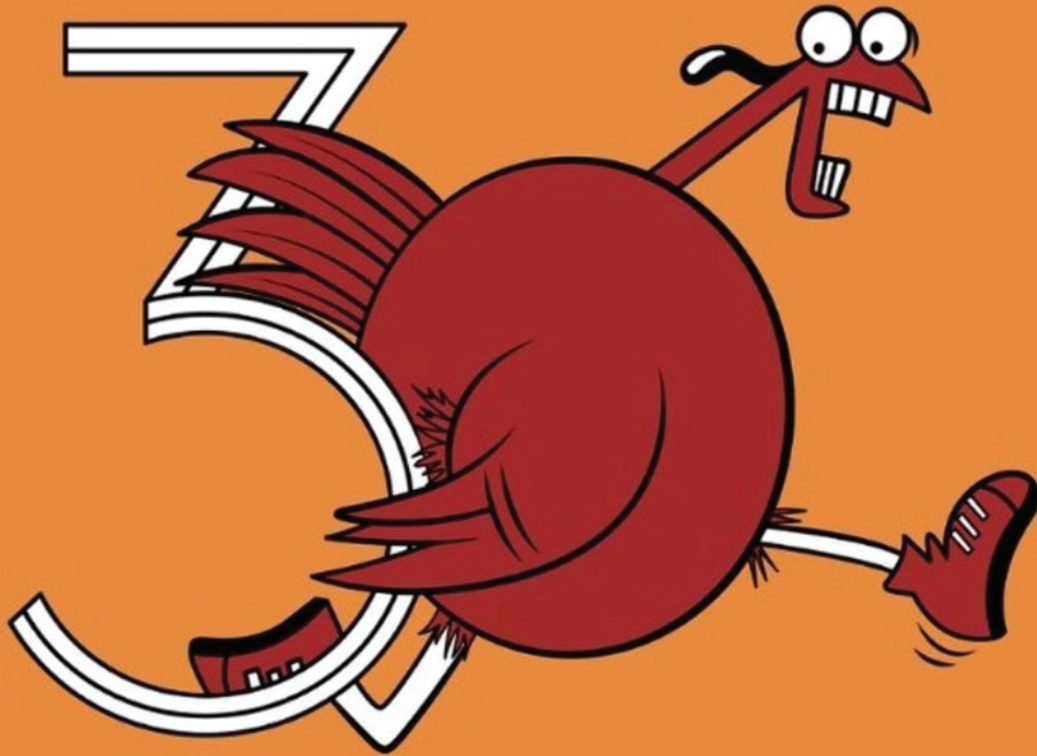
