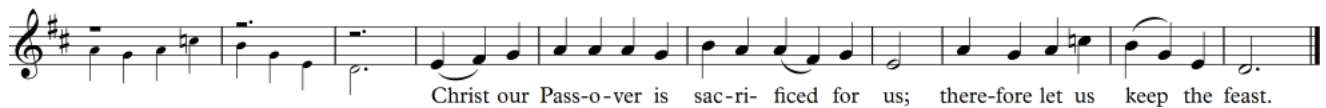

**MUSIC NOTES** David Ashley White (b. 1944) is an American composer and professor of composition at the University of Houston. His anthem *Comfort, comfort, ye my people* gives a fresh take on the beloved hymn we sing today in response to our Gospel reading. The hymn's joyous rhythm is heightened by White, cleverly uplifting this joyous tune to its fullest. George F. Handel (1685-1759) is most well-known for his oratorio *The Messiah*, containing many beloved individual movements. There are three large divisions in this oratorio, the first of which is focused on Advent and Christmas. "And the Glory of the Lord shall be revealed" features a beautiful text from the book of Isaiah. Handel demonstrates his brilliant skills in polyphony in this fugue, where different voice parts mimic each other, creating a wonderful proclamation very fitting for this Advent season.

**Reopening Plan** St. George's remains committed to staying open in a safe and responsible manner. Thank you for honoring these guidelines to keep St. George's a safe place.
